Tuba mirum

About the Artists

Dr. Betsy Uschkrat is a two-time Regional Finalist for the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions and winner of several operatic competitions including Mobile Opera's 2016 Competition, Shreveport Opera's 2009 Singer of the Year, Birmingham Opera's 2009 Competition, and the Fielder Grant of Austin, Texas. Past performances include The Kennedy Center in Washington D. C., New Orleans Opera, Opera Idaho, Shreveport Opera, Pensacola Opera, Des Moines Metro Opera, and Opéra Louisiane. Past roles include the title characters of Susannah, Manon, Roméo et Juliette, as well as *Carmen* (Michaela), *Dialogues of the Carmelites* (Blanche), *Don Giovanni* (Donna Anna), *L'elisir d'more* (Adina), *Die Zauberflüte* (Pamina), *Tabasco* (Fatima) and *Carousel* (Julie Jordan). Dr. Uschkrat is a graduate of the University of Houston, Indiana University and Louisiana State University. She competed in the Miss America Pageant as Miss Indiana 2006.

Dr. Chelsea Gallo Conductor Chelsea Gallo has been labeled a "rising star" within the conducting world (Anwar Nasir to the Associated Press.) She has been praised for her ability to, "...lead the orchestra with grace and fiery command" (Schubring). In addition to her responsibilities on the conducting staff for the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, Ms. Gallo is Assistant Conductor to the Louisiana Philharmonic Orchestra, Music Director of the Loyola Symphony Orchestra, Assistant Conductor to Opera Orlando, Conducting Fellow for the Dallas Opera, Cover Conductor for the Pittsburgh Symphony, Fellow for the "Turn the Spotlight" sponsorship in New York City, and a regular guest conductor with the Lancaster Symphony Orchestra in Pennsylvania. Most recently, her European management is through Music Et Talent Arist's Agency where she is represented by Isabelle Raché-Chappellier.

Chelsea holds a doctorate degree from the University of Michigan where she was awarded the Helen Wu Graduate Fellowship in Conducting. She studied orchestral conducting with conductor and educator Kenneth Kiesler. Her operatic studies were with Kathleen Kelly and Martin Katz. As an opera conductor, she has conducted productions of Mozart's *Le Nozze di Figaro* and *Don Giovanni*, Britten's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, amongst others.

Dr. Meg Frazier serves as Associate Dean of the College of Music and Media, Professor of Music, and Director of Choral Activities at Loyola University New Orleans, where she conducts choral ensembles and teaches conducting. Dr. Frazier is also the conductor of the choirs of NOVA, a community-based choral organization for singers in the greater New Orleans area and is the choral contractor for the Louisiana

Philharmonic Orchestra. Dr. Frazier is an active clinician, guest conductor, and adjudicator; she most recently conducted the Athena Festival celebrating female composers at Murray State University in Kentucky. In addition to singing as a chorister at St. Charles Avenue Presbyterian Church, Dr. Frazier serves as substitute cantor/pianist at numerous churches in the New Orleans area. Dr. Frazier lives in Metairie with husband Rob and Tallie the Wonder Dog; she is passionate about solar power, local coffee, and all things New Orleans.

Sofia Riggio is a graduate student who will receive her master's degree in conducting this May. Sofia grew up in New York, first developing her skills onstage as a singer, and then in the pit playing French horn. She received her B.M. in Music in 2016 from Loyola, during which she started as a choral conductor under the tutelage of Dr. Meg Frazier. She has previously conducted several choral works at the university, including her own compositions. Recently, Sofia conducted Puccini's *Suor Angelica* and *Gianni Schicchi* in April 2022 as well as Mozart's *The Impresario* and Purcell's *Dido and Aeneas* in April 2021 with Loyola Opera Theatre.
